### Author Rights

When you publish a book or an article, what rights do you sign away and which do you keep? It depends on the agreement you sign. Let's discuss what you should look for in an agreement with a publisher and what your rights are.

### Research Data Management

What is a data management plan, and why is it important? Keeping your research data properly organized and archiving it is not only helpful to you as a researcher, but it may also be a requirement for your funding. We'll discuss the basics of research data management, how to get started with a data management plan, and some options for archiving your data.

### Open Educational Resources (OERs)

Are you interested in using OERs for your course? Let us help recommend places to find OERs, share tips on assessing OER quality, help navigate Creative Commons licenses, or help support you or your team in producing open resources of your own.

### Research Metrics

Research metrics have an impact on you regardless of whether you know about them or not! Come learn about personal and publication level metrics and how they affect you.

### Literature Reviews for Social Sciences

If you are writing a literature review as a research assistant or for a course or honours thesis, come learn about research and organization for literature reviews. We will talk about what a literature review is, how to keep yourself and all your resources organized, and how to get started with finding all the research you will need.

Find out how these tools work, looking at some of the more common choices which include both free online options and RefWorks, for which TRU Library has an ongoing subscription.
